
Objectives of the Open Data Act (9th Dec. 2024)

- To enhance transparency and accountability in the dissemination and use of public data while maintaining the confidentiality and privacy of non-public data
- To make public data open and accessible to the public
- To optimise the use and management of public data in accordance with international standards and best practices
- To improve public services and promote private sector innovation and collaboration

Open Data Act: Requirements

To further the objectives of the Act, public authorities must publish the **public data** maintained in their data register in an open format and under an open licence, as follows:

- in a machine-readable format;
- in a format that is unencumbered by restrictions that would impede its use or reuse;
- in a format consistent with best practices and standards as approved by the Guyana National Bureau of Standards;
- in a format accessible to the public on an electronic platform, to the extent that the publication is not prohibited by law;
- at no cost to the public; and
- with no restrictions on copying, publishing, distributing, transmitting, citing or adapting.

PARLIAMENTARY OVERSIGHT BODIES

- Public Accounts Committee (PAC): oversees government's expenditure of funds
- Sectoral Committees on Foreign Relations, Social Services, Economic Services, and Natural Resources: oversee government policies, programmes and performance
- Standing Committee of Appointments (COA): responsible for the nomination of members to several constitutional bodies as well as the recruitment and appointment of the top three positions of the Financial Intelligence Unit and nominates the Board of the Natural Resource Fund and its Public Oversight and Accountability Committee.





 Assembly may refer to it;
- exercise general supervision over the functioning of the Auditor General in accordance with the Rules, Policies and Procedures Manual and any other law; and
- nominate the members of the Public Procurement Commission for approval by the National Assembly and, thereafter, the appointment by the President; and to determine the emoluments and allowances of the Public Procurement Commission in consultation with the Commission.




