Chief for Environment and Trade, Office of Environmental Quality and Transboundary Issues, Bureau of Oceans and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs, US Department of State

Rob Wing is the Chief for the Environment and Trade in the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Oceans and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs (OES). He is responsible for developing, implementing, and coordinating U.S. foreign policy on environment and trade issues, including development of Environmental Cooperation Agreements or similar mechanisms with U.S. trading partners. He also supervises implementation of approximately \$5 million a year in foreign assistance designated for trade-related environmental cooperation programs. Prior to joining OES, Mr. Wing spent nine years working in the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Office of General Counsel. There, he served as the Agency's primary staff attorney on a number of domestic and international pesticide and toxic chemical initiatives. Before EPA, Mr. Wing was an associate in the D.C. law firm of Crowell and Moring, where he worked in the environmental, business crimes, and litigation practice groups. Mr. Wing started his legal career clerking for the Honorable Deborah Chasanow on the U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland. Before law school, he worked at ICF Incorporated as an environmental consultant. Mr. Wing is a 1988 graduate of Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service and a 1994 graduate of the University of Maryland School of Law. He grew up in Havre, Montana, and after secondary school, spent a year as a foreign exchange student in Cairo, Egypt.
